## **SETH WILLIAMS ENDORSED BY GUARDIAN CIVIC LEAGUE**

*D.A. Candidate Picks up Another Major Law Enforcement Endorsement*

**PHILADELPHIA:** Seth Williams today picked up another major endorsement from a law enforcement group when he was endorsed by the Guardian Civic League Inc. of Philadelphia, a local chapter of The National Black Police Association. The Guardian Civic League represents more than 2,500 African-American active and retired police officers in Philadelphia.

“I am enormously proud to receive this endorsement today,” said Seth at the 11:00 AM event at the Guardians headquarters on Girard Avenue. “At a time when we need to fix our fundamentally broken criminal justice system and create a real working relationship between the police, the courts, the Office of the District Attorney and the community, the next District Attorney has to be someone who

The endorsement of the Guardian Civic League is the second major endorsement by law enforcement groups that Seth has received, following his backing by the PHA police. The Guardian Civic League Inc. of Philadelphia was founded in 1956 for the purpose of bringing together those members of the Philadelphia police department who were interested in civic betterment, through close cooperation between the police and the communities which they serve.

“We are endorsing Seth Williams for District Attorney because he is the only candidate who has not only the experience needed, but also a detailed plan to make every neighborhood safer,” said Bill Mahoney of the Guardians Civic League. “From assigning prosecutors to each neighborhood to taking illegal guns off the streets, Seth has the best plans for Philadelphia’s future.”

The endorsement of the Guardian Civic League is the latest in a string of high profile endorsements Seth has received and a clear sign of his growing momentum heading into the final five weeks of the D.A.s race. In the last two weeks, he has received the backing of the Black Clergy of Philadelphia and Vicinity and Philly for Change, one of the city’s leading progressive groups.
