SETH WILLIAMS FILES CAMPAIGN REPORT

Seth Has Raised Over \$400,000 for Campaign

PHILADELPHIA: Seth Williams has more than \$100,000 cash-on-hand for the last two weeks of his campaign for District Attorney. Seth raised more than \$400,000 for his campaign from 916 donors, including 632 donors since January 1 alone.

“With over \$100,000 on hand and contributions continuing to come in, we are in a strong position to win on May 19th,” said Dan Fee, Seth’s campaign manager. “Seth is the only candidate with the experience and the agenda to fix Philadelphia’s broken criminal justice system. With the support of people from across the city, Seth will win the primary and be Philadelphia’s District Attorney next year.”

Since January 1, Seth has raised \$253,011.28, bringing the amount raised during his campaign to \$408,530.70. The campaign spent \$227,789.03 since January, leaving it with \$104,731.62 for the final two weeks before the primary.

The average contribution for this period was just \$368 from 632 donors. 459 donors – or 75 percent of Seth’s donors – gave less than \$250. Individuals contributed \$206,149 of the money raised in this period.

Seth filed his campaign report on the same day he received the endorsement of the *Philadelphia Tribune*, the country’s oldest African-American newspaper. His campaign continues to pick up momentum heading into the final weeks of the campaign, with Seth receiving support from the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, the *Sunday Sun*, ACORN, Philly for Change, Neighborhood Networks, Americans for Democratic Action, Liberty City, the Guardian Civic League, the Fraternal Order of Transit Police and the Fraternal Order of Police Lodge #5 in the past few weeks alone. Seth has also been endorsed by the Black Clergy of Philadelphia and the Vicinity, more than a dozen former Assistant District Attorneys, 14 state elected officials, the Fraternal Order of Police Philadelphia Housing Authority and the Transportation Workers Union Local 234.
