**STATE REPRESENTATIVE CURTIS THOMAS  
ENDORSES SETH WILLIAMS FOR  
DISTRICT ATTORNEY**

*Legislator Declares Seth the Best Choice for Philadelphia*

**PHILADELPHIA:** State Representative Curtis Thomas added his name to the growing list of Seth Williams' supporters today when he endorsed his candidacy for Philadelphia District Attorney. The lawmaker, who represents parts of Fairmount, Northern Liberties and Kensington, declared Seth his choice for the office of the District Attorney, citing his extensive experience and dedication to reform.

"I am honored to receive the support of Representative Thomas," Seth said. "He has fought tirelessly for laws that make our communities safer places to live, work and raise a family. He is here because it is time for change in the City of Philadelphia, and he knows how important the District Attorney's Office is to that agenda of change."
